The short answer¹

- YEZTUGO is a prescription medicine used for HIV-1 PreP to reduce the chance of getting HIV-1 from sex in adults and teenagers who weigh at least 77 pounds (35 kg).
- YEZTUGO makes it hard for HIV-1 to replicate or copy itself. It does this by disrupting 3 different steps in the life cycle of HIV-1:
 - \circ It helps stop HIV-1 from entering the nucleus of your cells.
 - It interrupts the building and sending of HIV-1 out of cells.
 - \circ It disrupts the formation of the capsid of HIV-1.

Who is YEZTUGO for?¹

YEZTUGO is a prescription medicine used for HIV-1 PrEP to reduce the chance of getting HIV-1 from sex in adults and teenagers who weigh at least 77 pounds (35 kg). HIV-1 is the virus that causes Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS).



You must be HIV-negative to start YEZTUGO. You must get tested to make sure that you do not already have HIV-1.

What is YEZTUGO?¹


YEZTUGO is a prescription medicine used to reduce the chance of getting HIV-1.

The active ingredient in YEZTUGO is called a **capsid inhibitor**.

- A capsid is a shell that covers and protects HIV-1. It is needed for HIV-1 to replicate or make copies of itself.
- Inhibitor means that it interferes with the capsid doing its job.

How does YEZTUGO work to reduce the chance of getting HIV-1?¹

YEZTUGO binds to the capsid of the virus. This makes it hard for HIV-1 to make copies of itself. YEZTUGO interferes with replication by disrupting 3 different steps in the life cycle of HIV-1:





- It interrupts the building and sending of HIV-1 out of cells. It does this is by decreasing production of the parts needed to build the capsid.
- 3. It disrupts the formation of the capsid of HIV-1. This affects the structure of the capsid.

Glossary

AIDS (Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome): most advanced stage of HIV.

Capsid: a shell that covers and protects HIV-1. It is needed for HIV-1 to replicate (make copies of itself).

Capsid inhibitor: a class of medicines that interferes with HIV capsid.

DNA (Deoxyribonucleic acid): a type of genetic information inside a cell.

HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus): HIV is a virus that attacks the body's immune system. If HIV is not treated, it can lead to AIDS (acquired immunodeficiency syndrome).

Nucleus: the part of a cell where its genetic information is kept.

Pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP): means routinely taking prescription medicine before you're exposed to HIV to help reduce your chances of getting it.

Replication or replicate: means making a copy.
